

Making College Affordable

Ohio Christian University is committed to making college affordable, especially for ministry students. Many factors affect a student's debt load. Government overregulation is currently a major cause of higher education costs. To combat this trend, the OCU administration and Board of Trustees have taken action to assist students:

- ✓ The administration has a task force looking at how to cut administrative costs by 25%.
- ✓ A tuition freeze was approved for traditional programs for the 2014-2015 academic year.
- ✓ A three-year bachelor option was created to save traditional undergraduate students one year's tuition.
- ✓ A capital campaign was launched to increase scholarship funds.
- ✓ Financial stewardship is taught throughout the college experience.
- ✓ The Career Services office was opened to assist students and alumni with job procurement.


In addition to being equipped for ministry and careers, OCU students learn biblical stewardship principles throughout their educational journeys. Before, during, and after enrollment, students receive counseling and strategies to help minimize and repay debt, learn to create and follow a budget, and are assisted with job procurement. 

Record 517 Students Graduate

Ohio Christian University (OCU) conducted its 64th commencement on Saturday, May 3, with a record graduation of 517 students, including the first 19 graduates of the Master of Business Administration and Master of Management programs. Jacob Sunkel, of Heath, Ohio, was the valedictorian—the graduating senior with the highest cumulative grade point average, and Jessica vonBerge of Lebanon, Ohio, was the salutatorian—the graduating senior with the second highest cumulative grade point average.

Each year, OCU Honor Graduates are selected by the faculty. These graduates represent all the ideals of Ohio Christian University and must have distinguished themselves in academic achievement, Christian service, and leadership potential. The 2014 Honor Graduates are Matthew Harshbarger of Newark, Ohio, for the traditional program and Frank Tillotson of Columbus, Ohio, for the AGS program.






in OCU's 64th Commencement Ceremony




Commencement Speaker, Bill Jones



OCU Named Military Friendly School for 4th Consecutive Year!

For the fourth consecutive year, Ohio Christian University has been designated as a “Military Friendly School.” This recognition is given nationwide to only 20% of the colleges, universities, and trade schools that are committed to serving those who serve. The Military Friendly lists are “determined mathematically from data-driven survey submissions consisting of over 100 questions, compiled with assistance from our independent advisory boards.”

DEVELOPING YOUNG CHRISTIAN LEADERS



July 2014 was an exciting time on campus as the university once again partnered with Live God Loud Ministries to host the third annual LifeTraks School of Leadership, which trains Christian leaders with a biblical worldview. Thirty-one young people came to OCU to develop their personal leadership skills under the direction of staff leaders including Mr. Tony McCrary, Dr. Rick Christman, and Live God Loud Ministries LifeTraks Director of Operations Rev. Dan Coy. Students had opportunities to develop their professional skills through various work study projects, team building activities, community service, and area business visits. Third year students completed three-week practicums at various ministries in Ohio and Florida.

Evenings were filled with rehearsals for the drama tour, which included stops in Virginia and Pennsylvania. The final week of the program was spent at Appalachian Youth Camp, where students practiced the leadership techniques learned during their LifeTraks training. Camp concluded with the LifeTraks Commissioning Service of the eight students who completed the three-year program.

Tony McCrary states, "It was an honor to shake each student's hand and place the LifeTraks rings on their fingers, signifying not only the completion of the program but also a life committed to God and His kingdom first and foremost. I am so proud of these students."

Each participant testified that the experience was life changing. What an incredible month! The leadership challenge was significant, and the students' acceptance of that challenge was evident. LifeTraks School of Leadership is developing leaders.

Ohio Christian University is pleased to announce a new location for the College of Adult and Graduate Studies. In an effort to expand Christian education opportunities to students of the greater Columbus area, OCU has partnered with the First Church of God in Columbus, Ohio.

OCU has become a significant contributor to central Ohio workforce development through its relevant and affordable degree programs. AGS served fewer than 100 metro Columbus area adult students in 2007. As of January 2014, that figure has more than quadrupled with 413 adult students at the Columbus State Community College, Dublin, Grove City, Nationwide Children's Hospital, Daybreak Church, and Lighthouse Ministries locations. Space is maximized at these facilities, and the addition of the First Church of God location is critical in serving the growing number of OCU Columbus area students.

First Church of God (FCG) is located at 3480 Refugee Road in Columbus, only minutes from downtown. FCG's Pastor, Bishop Timothy Clarke, has faithfully served the ministry for 31 years, and the vibrant church serves thousands of members. The new agreement was created in collaboration with Dr. Marvin Miller, OCU's Columbus Director, and Bishop Clarke.

"Under the leadership of President Mark Smith and Bishop Timothy Clarke, both of these institutions are known for the stellar Christian services they give to their communities. I am excited that God has afforded us this wonderful opportunity as we continue to equip our students to become leaders throughout the world," offered Dr. Marvin Miller.



Dr. Stan Toler, OCU Alumnus and General Superintendent Emeritus for the Church of the Nazarene, visited Ohio Christian University's Circleville campus to share his experience and expertise with students, faculty, and staff. Dr. Toler spoke to students about leadership and preparing for ministry. A special session with faculty and staff centered on customer service principles from his book, *TERRIFIC! Five Star Customer Service*.

Preparing Students for Ministry

In a session with ministry students, Dr. Toler shared wisdom gained from his years of leading thriving ministries. Students were encouraged to focus on five principles: effort, enthusiasm, encouragement, effectiveness, and excellence. Using practical examples, Dr. Toler described how applying these five principles can determine the long-term impact of a ministry.

In a question-and-answer format, Dr. Toler encouraged students to be lifelong learners, including earning graduate degrees, and to find a good mentor for support and accountability. He emphasized the importance of spiritual disciplines, such as daily prayer and Bible study, and suggested practical training tools for young ministers. Many students reported being inspired by Dr. Toler's teaching.

For the university's faculty and staff, Dr. Toler provided materials and presented a training session based on his book *TERRIFIC! Five Star Customer Service*. This training was invaluable as the OCU team seeks to continually improve its services. The OCU community is thankful to Dr. Toler for investing in Ohio Christian University.



MISSIONS PROFESSOR LEADS COSTA RICA TEAM TO CONFRONT HUMAN TRAFFICKING

In response to student concerns about human trafficking and the challenge of CCCU General Superintendent, Dr. Tom Hermiz, Prof. Jamey Gremillion led 15 students to Costa Rica for a nine-day mission trip this summer. The outreach was focused on confronting human trafficking in a cross-cultural context.

As students worked alongside Steve and Elizabeth Gilroy of Face of Justice Ministries, they learned firsthand what it means to engage in the fight against human trafficking and sexual exploitation. Students applied real-world approaches to confronting these issues in a Christ-like manner. As part of the trip, students ministered in a variety of ways:

- Holding a prayer vigil outside one of the city's most notorious brothels.
- Helping trafficked victims to a place of safety where they can begin to receive the restoration of Christ.
- Serving teen mothers in a home that provides a Christian environment for them to learn basic life and work skills so they can stand on their own.
- Working with Face of Justice Ministries to raise awareness in the city of San Jose, Costa Rica.
- Performing street outreaches to minister to victims of human trafficking.


Professor Matthew Decker Leads Student Teams for Research in Ghana, West Africa



Teams of students led by Dr. Matt Decker, Assistant Professor of Psychology and Counseling, are gaining valuable experience in the field. Last year nine OCU students joined Dr. Decker on a research trip to Ghana, West Africa. The goal of the trip was to research rates of mental health symptoms among West Africans and to assess the level of Psychological Flexibility among Ghanaians. In May 2014, Decker and 12 OCU undergraduates returned to Ghana to continue the research and practice the skills they have learned in the classroom.

Dr. Decker uses the research trips to teach students interview skills used in ministry and apply lessons from the classroom. Students report that their lives are being changed, and some are even considering serving in this mission field in the future. Dr. Decker is known for his research and collaboration with Western Michigan University, and students love his academic research approach to ministry. Dr. Hank Kelly, OCU Provost, believes that Decker's research is a milestone in enhancing the degree options at OCU.

The mental health symptom research is part of a larger catchment study of mental health in West Africa. Students interviewed nearly 100 participants and were part of the largest single data collection event of the entire multi-year, multi-site data collection process, which will continue for several years. The Psychological Flexibility data were analyzed, and the student interview results were shared and combined with data from other universities.

OCU Online Student Reaches Cuba

Former Texas Rangers Pitcher Becomes OCU Student – Ministry in Cuba Has Helped Lead 70,000 to Christ!

Jonathan Johnson, a former Texas Rangers pitcher, retired from playing professional baseball with the goal of spreading the Gospel. After researching other colleges, he enrolled at OCU because its biblically-integrated curriculum aligns with his desire for spiritual growth. He is currently working toward a Bachelor of Arts in Christian Leadership and Ministry degree.

Johnson's baseball career began at Florida State University (FSU), where he led the Seminoles to an Atlantic Coast Conference championship and was inducted into the FSU Hall of Fame. After three seasons with the Seminoles, Jonathan was drafted in the 1st round (7th overall) by the Texas Rangers in 1995. He was signed by the Atlanta Braves in 2006.

As his career blossomed, Jonathan made a commitment to use the platform of baseball to glorify God. Honoring the Father Ministries, which Jonathan established using

his signing bonus, has touched over 900,000 lives and led nearly 70,000 people to accept Christ in the last 14 years.

Reaching Cuba for Christ is a passion Jonathan shares with his father, Johnny. In partnership with a Cuban professional baseball player, Osmani Sosa, more than 100 baseball teams have been established to spread the Gospel within the communist nation. Some of Cuba's communist party leaders have come to know Christ, and Cuban professional baseball players have begun promoting Christianity on their batting helmets, wearing stickers that read "true freedom is freedom from sin"—a powerful message for people whose government seeks to control most aspects of their lives.

Jonathan is using his talents and resources to glorify God and transform lives, and OCU seeks to equip many such servant-leaders to impact the world for Christ.

When Pastor Nate Swearingen ('04) was in sixth grade, he experienced a period of illness during which he drew closer to the Lord and began to feel a calling to youth ministry. This calling stayed in his heart even though he did not know what the future held. Then, in his junior year of high school, he tragically lost his father in an automobile accident. Nate found himself feeling isolated and felt the need to connect with fellow Christians at a deeper level. Through the tragedy, God was preparing him for what lay ahead.

After high school graduation, Nate visited several Christian colleges and settled on Circleville Bible College (now OCU). In his first semester, the call to youth ministry was confirmed and solidified. He joyfully recounts, "God got a hold of me! I totally committed my life to God, and He took off and showed off in my life."

While serving on the Summer Camp Ministry Team, Nate counseled a young man who responded during an invitation to meet Christ. Swearingen quickly discovered

the teen had recently lost his father and welcomed the opportunity to minister. Through Christ, Nate's personal tragedy became a triumph: he was able to relate with and counsel the young man!

God has continued to work through Pastor Nate as a youth minister. From his first pastorate at Circleville First Church, where he worked under the leadership of OCU Alumnus, Rev. Mike Holbrook, to his current ministry at Cypress Wesleyan as the Director of Student Ministries, Pastor Swearingen has diligently sought to help young people experience the transforming love of Christ and exemplify a life lived each day for Christ!

Federal Reserve Vice President Visits OCU Business Students

Ohio Christian University was pleased to host Dr. LaVaughn Henry, Vice President and Sr. Regional Officer of the Cincinnati Branch of the Federal Reserve Bank of Cleveland. Dr. Henry visited campus to present a session for OCU business students. The session covered a variety of economic topics, including the United States economy and job outlook.

Dr. Henry has more than 20 years of diverse experience in the fields of business economics, advisory services, federal regulation, and government affairs. He is a proven leader in delivering results based on entrepreneurial insight, analytical rigor, and knowledge of the policy-making environment.

He spoke to students about economic principles such as the value of higher education, the job market, factors influencing business decisions, and inflation. Dr. Henry discussed the current state of the U.S. economy and some of the factors that led to its recent downturn. After concluding that the future of the U.S. economy is bright, he admonished students to be smarter and work harder if they wish to find success in the current market.

Dr. Henry shared about personal experiences with failure and success, emphasized the importance of hard work and perseverance, and encouraged students to complete their studies. He reflected on professors and family members who challenged and invested in him. He, in turn, challenged the students present to take advantage of the faculty and administrators at OCU, who seek to invest in their spiritual, personal, and academic development.

Rev. Philip Batten

OCU celebrates the lives of two great community servants and friends of the university, Rev. Philip Batten, and Mr. James Bowman.

REV. PHILIP E. BATTEN, D.D., of Crestline, Ohio, went home to be with his Lord and Savior in January. He was born on September 22, 1950 in Parkersburg, West Virginia, graduated from Belpre High School in 1968, and graduated from Ohio Christian University in 1972 with a Bachelor of Arts in Religion. He graduated from Trinity Theological Seminary in 2002 with a Master of Arts in Biblical Studies and then obtained his Doctorate of Divinity from Ohio Christian University in 2011. He is survived by his wife, Delta (Casto). Rev. Batten invested his life in serving the children of Cleveland, Ohio, by developing a bus ministry called Heaventrain. Heaventrain is unique in that the Gospel is delivered to children in their neighborhoods, rather than transporting them to a church building.

Rev. Batten was founder of the Cleveland Train and Executive Director of Lighthouse, Inc. Continuing Rev. Batten's legacy of service are his sons, Andy, Executive Director of Lighthouse, Inc., and Jamey, Associate Athletic Director and Head Coach of Women's Basketball at OCU. The Phil Batten Scholarship Fund of Ohio Christian University was established in Rev. Batten's honor.


